A2Y Chamber Statement Opposing the Constitutional Convention Question on Michigan's November 3rd, 2026 Ballot

The A2Y Chamber opposes the Constitutional Convention question on the November 3rd, 2026 Michigan ballot. In accordance with Section 3 of Article XII of the Michigan Constitution, the November 3rd statewide ballot will ask the voters of the state of Michigan if they would like to hold a new constitutional convention. This question is constitutionally mandated to be asked every 16 years. Voters have rejected a constitutional convention when it was previously asked in 1978, 1994, and 2010, and they should vote no again in 2026.

A constitutional convention is a process that is too long, expensive, uncertain, and opaque to risk holding when our state can make needed reforms through legislation, ballot measures, and other routine efforts. A constitutional convention would also be subject to political spending from entities from outside the state with little to no transparency and accountability, all while empowering political insiders above everyday Michigan residents. The A2Y Chamber joins with a wide array of groups such as the Michigan Chamber of Commerce, the Michigan Education Association, Business Leaders for Michigan, the Michigan AFL-CIO, the Michigan League of Conservation Voters, the Michigan League of Women Voters, and many others to urge voters to vote no in November.
